## WELCOME ! .....

.....to the first issue of a newsletter designed to update all participants, contributors and supporters of the **BATS & "The Millennium Link"** Survey Project (**BaTML**).

We intend to produce two newsletters per annum (Spring & Autumn) keeping you informed about survey results and other activities.

So far we have received lots of support and encouragement, without which the project would have stood little chance of getting airborne.

Since coming up with the idea for **BaTML** in August 2000 (during a Daubenton's survey on the Union Canal), we have taken advantage of the bat free winter months to get ready for the launch. Preparations are now almost complete and soon we will be able to get down to studying these fascinating mammals of the night.



### What is **BATS & "The Millennium Link"** ???

It is a research project set up and co-ordinated by **Central Scotland Bat Group** to study bats and their use of habitat, along and adjacent to the Union and Forth & Clyde Canals.

The project, planned to take place over a five year period, is aimed primarily at Daubenton's Bats, however will also map the distribution of both Common and Soprano Pipistrelle species along these valuable wildlife corridors.

During this five year period we anticipate that more than 100 surveys will be carried out, collecting some 150 hours of data and covering 10% of the total canal surface area.

The Project Co-ordinator, Neil Middleton, will along with a number of Field Surveyors carry out most of the practical work.

We also benefit from the support of **British Waterways**, who have a vested interest in finding out about the wildlife that interacts with this area, which after heavy investment is undergoing a major regeneration.

### 2001 Activities

- **Surveys at 15 Randomly Selected Sites** spanning the whole of the canal area between Edinburgh and Glasgow.
- **Special Interest Surveys** at Avon Aqueduct and Falkirk Tunnel.
- **Bat Talks/Walks in August** Kilsyth (Auchinstarry Swingbridge) - 7.8.01 and Water Is Leith Visitor Centre - 30.8.01
- **Autumn/Winter 2001** Analysis, review & detailed reports made available to project contributors and participants.
- **October 2001 Newsletter** Issue 2 due out.
